## 2021/22 (complete)

#### • Initiate pricing reform

- Identify challenges (resourcing, billing system, data accessibility, etc)
- Develop long list of future pricing options
- Consult with interested parties (socalise ideas with retailers and consumers)
- Engage with consumers via surveys, workshops and informal communication
- Collate and monitor AMI and DER penetration
- Prepare for first round of LFC phase-out

## 2022/23 (in progress)

#### Implement

- first round of LFC fixed phase-out
- Updated new load policy to introduce option of profiled connections in congested locations
- Develop
- TOU prices for Groups 1 and 2
- allocation methodology for transmission costs to reflect new TPM

## 2023/24

#### Implement

- TOU prices for Groups 1 and 2
- Second round of LFC phaseout
- New cost allocation methodology for transmission costs under the new TPM.
- Develop
- LRMC model to inform fixed/variable price split
- Review
- Undertake a full review of Group 3 prices
- Monitor
- Effect of new Group 1 and 2 TOU prices.

### 2024/25

- Implement
- Changes to Group 3 prices identified in 23/24 review
- Third round of LFC phase-out
- Assess
- Effectiveness of Group 1 and 2 TOU prices and consider modifications/improvements.
- refinements to existing prices as developments (technological, retailer/consumer preference, DER penetration/economics, etc) occur.
- Opportunities to rationalize tariffs or price categories.
- Monitor
- Effect of new Group 3 prices
